The Importance of Myth and Legend



For millennia, myth and legend have been employed to carry spiritual allegories and politically uncomfortable truths into the public consciousness. At the beginning of the twentieth century, scholars tended to dismiss these myths as “inspired fiction” and steadfastly ignored the fact that tribal, national and religious traditions, including Christianity, deliberately generated their own mythologies to buttress their belief systems. Thanks to Joseph Campbell and others, there has been a radical revision of the true value of mythology. Myths are now known to be understood at many levels and are often a useful signpost to truth. Campbell declared that: “Mythology is the penultimate truth, because the ultimate cannot be put into words.” Anada Coomeraswamy claims that: “Myths embodies the nearest approach to absolute truth that can be stated in words.” Kathleen Raine, the poet, said, “Fact is not the truth of myth, myth is the truth of fact.”

The term “Holy Grail” is often claimed to be a corruption of the term “Holy Gradual”, in which the word ‘gradual’ is used in the sense of a slow spiritual ascent or initiatory pathway. In the early 1980’s the words “Holy Grail” or “Sangraal” as it is written in French, were defined as a corrupt version of Sang Real, or “Holy Blood,” in the book *The Holy Blood and The Holy Grail*. This was the first English-language mass publication that stated categorically that Jesus had married and founded a dynasty. It received a very mixed reception, being greeted with howls of protests alleging “blasphemy” and “heresy”

Cont...on the one hand, and on the other, equally loud cries of “brilliant” and “provocative.” This was nothing new, for the original Grail stories also provoked a mixed response – soon after their first publication, they were clearly regarded as a distinct irritant by Catholic Church. By that time, they had already gained wide public acceptance and suppression was out of the question. So the Church fell back on a tried and tested formula: it put out its own version and circulated it widely. It created a highly sanitized and censored variation of these stories that was in total conformity with Church doctrine. This “official” version became known as the Vulgate Cycle and became the foundation for later writers such as Thomas Mallory, whose *Morte d’Arthur* in 1469 sealed the link between the Arthurian legends and the Grail sagas. The Church had apparently solved the problem of the heresy in the original sagas, in a manner that was to endure for centuries.
